- 1. How far do you agree with the observation that Romantic poetry is 'escapist' and lacks a grip on actuality?
- 2. 'Romanticism is the widening of the imaginative horizon and a sharpening of emotional sensibility.' Substantiate this statement with illustrative references.
- 3. How does Blake blend childlike innocence with adult wisdom in 'The Tyger' and 'The Lamb'?
- 4. Examine the use of symbolism in 'The Tyger' and 'The Lamb'.
- 5. Show how 'Tintern Abbey' traces Wordsworth's spiritual growth as a poet?
- 6. Give a descriptive picture of Wordsworth's changing relationship with Nature, as expressed in the 'Tintern Abbey'.
- 7. What aspects of the Romantic imagination are brought out in Coleridge's 'Kubla Khan'?
- 8. Would you dismiss Coleridge's 'Kubla Khan' as an incoherent opium dream or do you find it meaningful? Discuss.
- 9. Bring out the skill and variety of Shelley's lyric genius with special reference to the poems prescribed for you.
- 10. Show, with reference to the 'Ode to the West Wind' and 'To a Skylark', how Shelley uses objects of nature as vehicles of his own personality and thought.
- 11. Show, how the different moods of the poet are brought out, in the selection of Keats's odes in your syllabus.
- 12. How does Keats explore the capacity of imagination to transcend reality in 'Ode to a Nightingale'?
- 13. Analyse Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein* as a Gothic Novel.
- 14. Comment on Mary Shelley's use of Nature in Frankenstein.
- 15. Estimate Charles Lamb as a writer of 'familiar' essays with reference to the pieces in your course.
- 16. Comment on the view that pathos is the most striking quality of Lamb's essays, with reference to the essays in your course.
