





Third Dr. Nisith Ranjan Ray Memorial Lecture

Fourth Nisith Ranjan Ray Memorial Lecture


Date: 27th April 2023 Speaker: Prof. Amit De






Fifth Nisith Ranjan Ray Memorial Lecture
