His talk covered a vast expanse and unfurled the Indian Cinema (1913-41): From Silence to Protest in front of our enthusiasm filled students. They came to know a lot of the history of the becoming of our Cinema.

The 7th day of the Add on course Ideas of Nation and Nation Building: A Film Appreciation Course on Indian Cinema, organised by Department of History & the IQAC of St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College was held on 13th October 2023. Dr. Siddhartha Biswas, the Head, Department of English, Calcutta University was today's speaker. His lecture was on The Trinity of Cinema in Bengal. Sen- Ghatak-Ray and their cinema was what Dr. Biswas introduced our students to. The two hours just flew by and ended with a lively discussion analysis and reminiscing those time.

The 8th day of the Add on course Ideas of Nation and Nation Building: A Film Appreciation Course on Indian Cinema, organised by Department of History & the IQAC of St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College was held on 24th November 2023. Dr. Sutapa Rani Dasgupta from the Department of History was today's speaker. Her lecture was on Partition of India and Cinema. She introduced our students to the post partition changes in society and the changing role of women reflected in cinemas.

The 9th day of the Add on course Ideas of Nation and Nation Building: A Film Appreciation Course on Indian Cinema, organised by Department of History & the IQAC of St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College was held on 28 th November 2023. Prof. Mousumi Mukhopadhyay from the Department of History was the speaker. Her lecture was on Dalit in Indian Cinema. She introduced our students to the reflection of Dalits in Indian Cinema through her interpretations of Achyut kanya (1936), Sujata (1959), Sadgati (1981), Paar (1984), Masan (2015), Fandry (2013- Marathi). The intention behind her choice of the topic was to inspire the students to rethink Dalit politics of India.

The 10th day of the Add on course Ideas of Nation and Nation Building: A Film Appreciation Course on Indian Cinema, organised by Department of History & the IQAC of St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College was held on 30th November 2023. Dr. Anindita Ghosal, Department of History, Diamond Harbour Women's University was today's speaker. Her

lecture was on Partition and Indian Cinema. She introduced our students to the realities of partition in and how it impacted Bengal and the northeastern states. It was a very interesting and interactive session

The 11th day of the Add on course Ideas of Nation and Nation Building was held on Friday, 1st December and the speaker was Prof. Santanu Banerjee, Department of History, St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College. His topic was "Hope, apprehension and despair: Bollywood blockbusters in early Independent India".

The 12th day of the Add on course Ideas of Nation and Nation Building was held on 4th December 2023. Dr. Chaitali Maitra from Department of English was the speaker. Her lecture was on Relationship in Indian Cinema. She very interestingly unveiled the changing courses of Indian cinema through ages.

The 13th day of the Add on course Ideas of Nation and Nation Building was held on 5th December 2023. Dr. Anasuya Bhar from Department of English was the speaker. Her lecture was on Conflicts in Nationalisms: A Study of Satyajit Ray's *Ghare Baire*. Dr. Bhar's critical analysis of Ray's interpretation of Rabindranath's *Ghare Baire* helped our students in understanding not only Ray but also the historical implication of the time.

The 14th and the last day of the Add on course Ideas of Nation and Nation Building: A Film Appreciation Course on Indian Cinema, organised by Department of History & the IQAC of St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College was held on 6th December 2023. Prof. Tayana Chatterjee from Department of English was the speaker. Her lecture was on Reinterpreting the Idea of Nationhood through Modern Hindi Films. It was a very lively interactive session. After the lecture the students were required to sit for an examination before the closing ceremony where the students were awarded certificates for successful completion of the course.
