Event Report

Report on the Third Annual Heritage Walk to Victoria Memorial

The Department of English, St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), organized the Third Annual Heritage Walk to the Victoria Memorial Museum on 6 February 2026 for the students of English Major, Semester I. The programme was designed as an experiential learning initiative intended to familiarize students with the historical and architectural heritage of Kolkata while complementing their academic engagement with literary and cultural history.

Kolkata, once regarded as the second city of the British Empire, remains marked by numerous architectural and cultural legacies of British colonial rule. An understanding of this built heritage is particularly valuable for students of English literature, as the colonial encounter shaped many of the social, cultural, and intellectual contexts within which nineteenth- and early twentieth-century literary texts were produced. The heritage walk was therefore conceived as an opportunity for students to develop a more tangible and contextual understanding of colonial history through direct engagement with one of the city's most significant historical monuments.

The assembly point for the walk was the North Gate of the Victoria Memorial, where the students gathered at the scheduled time. The visit was conducted under the supervision of the faculty members Tayana Chatterjee, Dr. Anasuya Bhar, Dr. Syeda Ayesha Ali, and Kush Sengupta, who accompanied the students throughout the programme.

During the walk, the students were introduced to the architectural style of the Victoria Memorial, which represents a synthesis of classical European elements and Indo-Saracenic influences. The faculty members highlighted various architectural features of the monument, encouraging the students to observe the structure not merely as a tourist landmark but as a historical artifact shaped by the aesthetic and ideological impulses of the colonial period.

Following the discussion of the monument's architectural features, the students visited the museum and galleries housed within the Victoria Memorial. The exhibits offered valuable insights into the history of British rule in India, the cultural and political life of colonial Bengal, and the broader historical environment that forms the backdrop of many nineteenth-century literary works studied in the curriculum. The visit thus enabled students to connect their classroom learning with the material history of the period.

The heritage walk proved to be a meaningful and enriching educational experience for the students. By engaging directly with the architectural and historical landscape of the city, the participants were able to develop a deeper appreciation of Kolkata's cultural heritage while

also reflecting on the historical contexts that inform the study of English literature.
