

Annual Students' Seminar 2026

The #Department_of_Economics of St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College successfully organized its Annual Students' Seminar on 24th March 2026 from 12 noon under the aegis of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The seminar was centered on the contemporary and highly relevant theme, "West Asia Crisis and its Impact on the Global Economy."

The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from students, who were organized into groups comprising both Semester I and Semester VI participants. This structure fostered collaborative learning and encouraged an exchange of ideas across different academic levels.

The presentations covered a wide spectrum of issues arising from the ongoing crisis. Topics ranged from the global oil crisis and concerns of energy security to the potential economic ramifications of the closure of the Strait of Hormuz. Other groups explored disruptions in semiconductor supply from Taiwan, rising energy costs and their effect on the Consumer Price Index, challenges in fertilizer supply impacting agriculture, and labour market disruptions alongside migration issues triggered by conflict.

The seminar was evaluated by Prof. Indrani Banerjee and Prof. Ruth Rhea Khan, who commended the participants for their analytical depth, clarity of presentation, and engagement with current global issues. Awards were presented for the First, Second, and Third positions, along with a Best Speaker Award.

The programme concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Prof. Sudeshna Mitra, who expressed gratitude to all contributors for ensuring the success of the seminar.

The seminar served as an enriching academic platform, enhancing students' understanding of global economic dynamics while encouraging critical thinking and collaborative learning.
