

Steps taken by the Department to improve student outcomes

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 emphasizes that improving student results should not mean only preparing students for examinations.

1. Identify weak students early- based on class response or class tests conducted.
2. Identify their learning gaps- conceptual or language.
3. Maintain a student performance database (regular poster, essay, extempore, quiz sessions) besides university examination.
4. Give special academic support to students (Remedial classes) who are at risk of failing.
5. Regular mentoring of weak students who need counselling or guidance for specific papers. The mentor mentee endeavour is geared to provide students easy and comfortable access to their students.
6. Providing study materials or e- resources to complement textbook reading.
7. Conducting or notifying students to attend West Bengal Political Science Association webinars that deal with the topics of their syllabus.
8. Faculty moves beyond lecture-only teaching and uses discussion, debate, case studies, experiential learning.
9. ICT and digital resources are used in class by faculty to encourage students to make PPT during their annual students' seminar.
10. Provide remedial classes to help the students who are having trouble with topics taught in class.
11. Organising at least one class trip to either a museum or a heritage walks to provide students an experiential learning opportunity as well a time to bind and build a relationship with each other.
